

Admission of Migrant Students Policy

5306

The school board recognizes that the process used to identify migrant children upon enrollment is implemented. The term 'migratory child' means a child who is, or whose parent or spouse is, a migratory agricultural worker, including a migratory dairy worker, or a migratory fisher, and who, in the preceding 36 months, in order to obtain, or accompany such parent or spouse, in order to obtain, temporary or seasonal employment in agricultural or fishing work has moved from one school district to another or resides in a school district of more than 15,000 square miles, and migrates a distance of 20 miles or more to a temporary residence to engage in a fishing activity.

A copy of the form, Migrant Student Data Entry Form, must be used to identify migrant children through inclusion in the enrollment packet given to each new student and their family. Additionally school will facilitate the identification of migratory children by including the Migrant Education School Survey in the school's enrollment packet. (The survey will be administered to ALL new enrollees.)

Results of the survey must be forwarded to Union # 93's NCLB Coordinator, who then will provide the information to the State Migrant Education Office. Administrative secretaries, principals and teachers must also check in with families during everyday interactions and refer them to the NCLB Coordinator if they believe they may qualify for additional services.
